WORK CULTURE IN THE PRE NOVICIATE

The Pre-novitiate is the first stage of formation in our Oblate life, and during this same period, we do our first BA Degree in Philosophy and Spirituality studies for four years in Zambia, before proceeding to the Novitiate in South Africa or U.S.A.

The Pre-novitiate is one of the most enjoyable stages of formation in the program, in such a way that it is characterized by various activities such as, Livestock production, Vegetable gardening and raising of chickens, which are activities done for self-sustainability. There are also social activities like sports, which we do, sometimes with other communities or among ourselves as St. Eugene says " first of all be human, then a Christian and strive to be a Saint." We also have prayers for our Spiritual growth, these and many other activities are done to keep ourselves in praver and our Oblate Spirituality.

Missionary oblates- Zambia

There is a common saying that goes like, it's only after you have stepped outside your comfort zone that you begin to change, grow and transform, and this saying is reminding me of the knowledge about the Oblates of Mary Immaculate I acquired during my first year and through different experiences. I come from an Oblate background in the sense that my parish happens to be the first Oblate parish in Zambia. And this gave me courage that I know about the Oblates, yet I only knew a little. But before I share my experiences in the first year, I would love to give a gist of who the Oblates are. Their official name is Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate but at times called Oblates, Oblates fathers or O.M.I. who were found by St. Eugene De Mazenod. It all began on 8th September, 2016 when my six brothers and I were officially accepted into the pre-novitiate house. Speaking for myself during my stay at De Mazenod house in first year, was in some ways challenging because it was a different experience, a different people with different backgrounds and a different kind of lifestyle. Coming from a home where I used to eat alone and at my own time to a community life where we eat togrther as one family and share different ideas. And little did I realize that this was the beginning of getting to know how the Oblates live in community. But because of the people (formators and prenovices) we found were so welcoming and helpful, we felt at home and incorporated into the programme.

As a young person, trying to fit myself in the new community, I carried with myself expectations about the community life especially that of the Oblates, though I had ideas of who Oblates were backway home. Entering in the Oblate way of life, I found community life so interesting and impressive especially with the programmes that were set in the early stage. Oblate spirituality being one of the programmes that one has to do during first year, helped me to realize and know more about the Oblates. I remember one of the sessions of Oblate spirituality talking about St. Eugene De Mazenod's life history and how he founded the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate.



We were also doing sports and working in our respective areas of responsibility, this gave me a thought that being a priest is more than just being in church, preaching to the faithful and celebrating Mass but more than that. As if it is not enough, we could talk about the Oblates who are involved different works, those who minister to the most abandoned, the poor, parish work, and many other ministries.

My experience in the first year is so vast with so many things such as presenting topics concerning the Oblates and the church at large and giving reflections on radio Maria Yatsani in Bauleni.

In a nutshell, one might ask, what is the main aim of the first stage (first year), well it introduces one to the oblate way of life, helps one to deepen his vocation and getting to know more about the founder, St Eugene and the Oblates.

THE PLIGHT OF THE SICK: A UTH PASTORAL EXPERIENCE

The pre-novitiate house in its preparation for future ministries of Oblates in initial formation take up different dimensions of pastoral work/placements. Hospital ministry is part of the pastoral placements that prenovices do for six weeks in their second year and another six weeks in third year, twelve weeks in total. Pre-novices at the end of it get acquainted with basics in Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE).

Nevertheless, the presence of the Oblate pre-novices never go unnoticed at the University Teaching Hospital in Lusaka. Oblate pre-novices are the only group doing pastoral for such a length and get certificates in Clinical Pastoral Education. However, the most important aspect of UTH pastoral experience is our closeness to the poor, the sick. The plight of the sick cries out for the salvation in their moment of illness, seen as moments of trail. It is only through Jesus Christ the great physician that they can fully have firm hope of a perfect healing and our presence is only a manifest sign of Christ's love. We stand with the sick in difficult moments although we cannot offer a surest hope of healing, we clothe them with the love of Christ. Their conditions of pain, hopelessness, instability and illness compels us to love and care for our brothers and sisters in their sickness for we cannot give what we do not possess. Christ's love and the zeal to serve are our primary conditions in our pastoral engagements and thus we give love in humble service. It is in serving where we find joy and generously put ourselves at the service of the poor.



Each and every year, the Missionary Oblates assign pre-novices to the University Teaching Hospital for a six weeks period of clinical pastoral experience. The aim of this experience is first, to extend the love of our Lord Jesus Christ to the patients, to understand the true human dignity and to fulfil the founders words "reaching out to the poor with their many faces."

PRAYER FOR OBLATE VOCATIONS

Jesus told us that whatever we ask of you in his name, you will grant it.

So we make this prayer to you with faith, sure that you will hear us. Mary immaculate, who first gave Jesus to the world, be with us as we pray. Oblate formation centers the Oblate's life on responding to the call of Jesus Christ "you did not choose me but I have chosen you, and appointed you, that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should remain" (john 15:16; cf. C. 1).

Like the apostles, the Oblate commits himself to follow Christ and he patterns his entire life on that of Christ, "cooperating with the savior and imitating his example" (C .1). Like our founder, the Oblate is passionately committed to Jesus Christ." Like st Paul, the Oblate seeks to say "for me to live is Christ" (Philippians 1:21). It is in Jesus Christ the savior that the oblate finds the Centre, unity and meaning of his life. Oblate formation is at the service of this response.

THE PRISON MINISTRY

The prison service or the correctional service is one of the agencies of criminal justice, whose aim is to rehabilitate, to control and take care of the prisoners. Our primary mission as Oblates is to proclaim Jesus Christ and his kingdom both to those who do not know Him and those who have lost sight of the hope which He brings; in order to lead them to the fullness of life. Most of the prisoners have lost hope in God because of the sufferings and pain they go through in prison. One obvious question which they ask themselves is that, is God present in their suffering? This is simply because their sufferings are too much for them to bear and this question has led most of the prisoners to lose hope in God.

One ministry our founder Saint Eugene De Mazenod was involved in was the prison ministry, to help the prisoners and to bring hope to them. Just like we are challenged in the Gospel of Matthew: 25 vs 34-40, when Jesus identified himself with the sick, hungry, strangers and prisoners. Today Jesus Christ wants us also to find him in those people who are abandoned and persecuted and those who are suffering due to different reasons.

My visit at *Mwembeshi Open Prisons*, was a challenging moment and at the same time a life giving experience, the reason being that the joy and happiness the prisoners showed to us was extra ordinary to me. Because almost everyone had a Bible others even the Rosary. And this shows how God is working in their lives through preaching from different pastors and priests. Prison ministry is one of the ministries neglected by many people because of the misconceptions behind it. However, for me, working with such people is really a good thing because you really give hope to the hopeless, and this is the call of our lord Jesus Christ to give hope to the hopeless. My dear brothers if we want to achieve this mission of our lord Jesus Christ then working with everyone, especially the abandoned such as the
